

OCIA

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) is established for the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the Sacraments of Initiation - Baptism. Confirmation, and the Eucharist.

This process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal of faith as it welcomes new members into the Church.

The Order speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey" centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church He founded. This journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time to bring about community and commitment to the liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful.

OCIA is a restoration of the ancient catechumenate, arising within the first three centuries following the era of the apostles. It was the early Church's way of Christianizing the pagan Roman Empire. The Second Vatican Council called for the restoration and use of this venerable and powerful method of initiation for the worldwide Church.

OCIA is for:

- Individuals who are not Catholic who know they want to join the Church or who may be interested but need more information
- Catholics who have never received the sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation

Married couples of mixed religious faiths who wish to unite their religious practice in Catholicism

3 Local Catholic Families Need Assistance

We are aware of one domestic violence victim and two hard-working families that need some assistance.

- One woman who was a victim of domestic violence is needing some rent assistance. We helped her with partial rent
 once last year. Her situation has changed and she is looking into moving into a less-expensive place. She is planning
 to get a second job also. We are looking into raising a half-a-month's rent, and possibly some funds for a security
 deposit for her next apartment. This is a limited situation and we'd like to get her on better financial footing. We will
 be working on her budget and are arranging food assistance thru St. Vincent de Paul (Thank you SVdP)!
- A family of a separated mom with several children needs a highway-worthy car in good repair. If anyone has a car in
 good repair that can be given to this family, we would be grateful. This mom also needs a financial cushion because
 she is not getting much help from her husband, and she is working two jobs already.
- The other family is a single woman with one child still at home, who is also providing assistance to her grandparent. We will be helping with referrals for assistance for the grandparent, and offering budgeting advice.
