The Miracle of Bolsena - Orvieto, Italy



In 1263 a German priest, Peter of Prague, stopped at Bolsena while on a pilgrimage to Rome. He is described as being a pious priest, but one who found it difficult to believe that Christ was actually present in the consecrated Host. While celebrating Holy Mass above the tomb of St. Christina (located in the church and named for this

martyr), he had barely spoken the words of Consecration when blood started to seep from the consecrated Host and trickle over his hands onto the altar and the corporal.

The priest was immediately confused. At first he attempted to hide the blood, but then he interrupted Mass and asked to be taken to the neighboring city of Orvieto, the city where Pope Urban IV was then residing.



The Pope listened to the priest's account and absolved him. He then sent emissaries for an immediate investigation. When all the facts were ascertained, he ordered the Bishop of the



diocese to bring to Orvieto the Host and the linen cloth bearing the stains of blood. With archbishops and cardinals and other Church dignitaries in attendance, the Pope met the procession and, amid great pomp, had the relics placed in the cathedral. The linen corporal bearing the spots of blood is still reverently enshrined and exhibited in the Cathedral of Orvieto.



URGENT! Time is running out!

The Empower Illinois Invest in Kids Act will expire at the end of this calendar year if



our legislators do not act to renew or extend the program. This program has provided funding for 133 students to attend Holy Cross School over the last 6 years. The last legislative session of the year is the Veto Session which begins on Oct. 24th and will end on Nov. 9th. If nothing is done, the law will sunset, and with it the Empower Illinois Tax Credit Scholarship Program. This program has helped us raise around \$100,000 a year in scholarship funds for our students. Many of our families rely on these funds to be able to send their children to Holy Cross. Please **contact your lawmaker** to make sure they know Tax Credit Scholarships are a priority for their constituents. We also invite you to join us in praying for this program to be renewed. Joining us in praying the Novena for Catholic Schools beginning on Oct. 15th. The last day of the novena will be on Oct. 24th, the first day of the legislative session. In the meantime, all funds received through Empower for this coming school year will still be distributed regardless of the program possibly expiring at the end of December. We still have 63 eligible students on the list for an Empower IL scholarship. October is National Bully Awareness Month. Here at Holy Cross we support a **Bully Free School Environment**. As part of our continued effort to provide awareness against bullying, we will implement a month of bully-free activities. This will be beneficial to all students and staff at Holy Cross.

October 2—6: Bully Awareness Workshop for Grades K-8

Bully Awareness Workshops will be held for all students in all grades to educate them about the harms and dangers that bullying causes, and to show students what they can do to prevent and stop bullying.

October 10—13: Culture Awareness Week

This week we will focus on the variety of cultures we have at Holy Cross.

October 16—20: Stand Up for Others Against Bullying Week This week we will focus on the theme "Friends lead, bullies divide."

Did you know students who experience bullying are more likely to find peer actions more helpful than an educator or self-actions? By teaching children to stand up for one another, they learn to not only help their classmates and the importance of bully prevention, but that they can always turn to their classmates for help and support.

October 23—27: Share-a-Kind-Word Week

Students will participate in creating posters, with positive messages on post-lt notes, handing them out to students at school, and share inspirational stories in the classroom.

October 30: Blue Shirt Day to Support Bullying Awareness

Students and staff will demonstrate their commitment to ending bullying by wearing either a navy or light blue school uniform polo shirt.

With your help, we hope to foster a safe, educational school environment where all students learn of the harms of bullying, and the importance of stopping bullying and supporting its awareness.



FATHER MICHAEL McGIVNEY: THE STORY OF THE CONNECTICUT PRIEST WHO FOUNDED THE KNIGHTS OF THE COLUMBUS

Father Michael McGivney is a documentary that brings to life the story of one of America's most extraordinary Catholic priests. Born in Connecticut of Irish immigrant parents just a few years before the Civil War, Michael McGivney grew up at a time when millions of Catholic immigrants were struggling to overcome poverty and prejudice. As a parish priest in the gritty New England manufacturing town of New Haven, he made a deep impact on his community, earning the respect of the Protestant establishment and the love of his parishioners at St. Mary's Church. Emboldened to care for families threatened by the death of the breadwinner, Fr. McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus, a mutual benefit society that today remains the world's largest Catholic lay organization with 1.8 million members in 13 nations. This film offers a rare glimpse into the life of an extraordinary priest and visionary leader. From defending the persecuted Church to protecting widows and orphans, Father Michael McGivney celebrates the triumphs and tribulations of a priest who may very well be America's first canonized parish priest.
