Dear Friends,

In a post-COVID world, airports are a funny thing. One thing I have noticed remains hard for me to accept: the judgmental thoughts that run through my mind: "Who didn't wipe down that counter-



top?" "What is wrong with that person?" "I'd never dress like that." And, I am sorry to admit, the list could go on and on. I think the best and the worst of us can come out when we are trying to move on from wherever we are—but the real question for you and me is, "What is really going on in my head and in my heart?"

As I reflected on the critical spirit, I noticed that the biggest finger I was pointing was at myself: "What is wrong with me?" Now, there is only one answer to that question — but it is the hardest answer to accept: there is nothing wrong with me. God made me good. Sometimes I make bad choices; sometimes I sin. That is when I need to run to the Lord for His mercy and forgiveness — especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

There is only one way to heal a broken heart, only one way to stop the cycle of judgmental thoughts and negative self-talk. It is the way of love. In this life, the most profound encounter we can have with God — who is love — is in the sacraments, especially Reconciliation and the Eucharist.

If you have been away from confession for a while, it is never too late to seek God's merciful love in that powerful sacrament. And this weekend, when you go to Mass, as the priest invites you to "lift up your heart" at the beginning of the Preface, don't be afraid to imagine that broken heart of yours and offer it completely to Jesus. He wants you to be part of His Paschal Mystery — His own Passion, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension, which we are invited to experience at every Mass! How marvelous.

It is through this encounter with Jesus Christ that healing and conversion are cultivated and truly all things are made new. Let's follow where our Master has gone before us and rediscover our dignity, value, and worth as beloved children of the Father!

URGENT! TIME IS RUNNING OUT!

The Empower Illinois Invest in Kids Act will expire at the end of



this calendar year if our legislators do not act to renew or extend the program. This program has provided funding for 133 students to attend Holy Cross School over the last 6 years. The last legislative session of the year is the Veto Session which begins on Oct. 24th and will end on Nov. 9th. If nothing is done, the law will sunset, and with it the Empower Illinois Tax Credit Scholarship Program. This program has helped us raise around \$100,000 a year in scholarship funds for our students. Many of our families rely on these funds to be able to send their children to Holy Cross. Please <u>contact your lawmaker</u> to make sure they know Tax Credit Scholarships are a priority for their constituents.

In the meantime, all funds received through Empower for this coming school year will still be distributed regardless of the program possibly expiring at the end of December. We still have 63 eligible students on the list for an Empower IL scholarship. If you donate to Holy Cross School through Empower Illinois, you will receive 75% of your donation back as a credit on your Illinois state taxes. From the Desk of Principal Koerner:

With the end of the first quarter drawing near, I would like to thank all of our teachers, staff, families, parishioners, stakeholders and the Holy Cross community for their continued support. We could not have made it to the end of this successful quarter without the support, prayers, and generosity of you all. WE ARE TRULY BLESSED.

Have I shared how special our teachers are? Each of us has at least one special talent that we need to practice, and the Lord will lead us to use our talents best when we provide them for the good and enjoyment of others. Our teachers here at Holy Cross have amazing talents. I have witnessed their talents shine through when they are standing in front of a classroom teaching. A tremendous round of applause please for our teachers!

Giving our teachers the resources that they need to demonstrate their talents has been one of my goals. As you know, the resources needed this school year are expensive with inflation being what it is. The influx of 74 new students and an overall enrollment of 254 students has greatly added to our cost. Year to date, we have had to purchase 30 new chrome books, 10 iPads, 40 sets of headphones, and 2 mobile charging carts for the chrome books and iPads for a total of \$13,510. Other costs added to this school year was the west wall window replacement, which totaled \$159,000. With the window project complete, I still need to have blinds installed on the windows at a cost of \$7,928. One other major expense this year was replacing window air conditioners at a cost of \$12,329.

Our time, talents and treasure are on loan to us from God, and if you are able, give them away with unlimited generosity. In this light, the generosity of a few Holy Cross donors has partially offset the above costs. However, we still have a shortfall in the current budget. So, please pray about any contribution that might help offset this deficit. Your talent might be providing lunch for the teachers, sharing a little bit of your treasure to the school by giving a little bit more to the school or parish, coming to our Cabaret Night fundraiser, adopting a chrome book at \$370, or an iPad at \$360, or offering your prayers for the health, safety, and success of our Holy Cross community. Whatever you choose, know that we are so thankful for your support.


Planned Parenthood is the largest single abortion supplier in the U.S. According to their 2021-22 annual report, they performed over 374,155 abortions in the U.S.
