



**POPE: MAY WE ALL JOIN IN
WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY**

Pope Francis has invited everyone to participate in the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity from 18 to 25 January, which this year focuses on a theme relating the experience of the Magi, who came from the East to Bethlehem to worship the Messiah King: "*We saw the star in the East, and we came to worship him.*"

The Pope said that in a similar way, Christians of diverse backgrounds and traditions "are pilgrims on our way to full unity" who come closer to our goal when keeping our gaze fixed on Jesus.

The Pope encouraged us to pray for Christian unity and also offer up our struggles and suffering.

Prayer for Christian Unity

Loving God, we ask that you grant us
the spirit of wisdom and unity,
so that we may be one,
even as you are one with our
Lord Jesus Christ—and he with you.

Enable all the members of the body of Christ
to live together in unity and fellowship with one
another, and lead us into the paths of
peace and righteousness so that we
may be well pleasing in your sight.

We ask you to teach us how to
love one another as Christ loved us
and help us to show one another
the unusual kindness that can only come
from knowing your Son, Jesus.

May the Spirit stir up in our hearts a desire
to be united as one, in the bond of
peace and fellowship.
This we ask in Jesus' name.
Amen.

ADULT FORMATION—THE CREED

Adult Formation is here! Bishop Robert Barron’s “Word on Fire” Study Program—*The Creed*

Recent decades have witnessed a surge of the religiously unaffiliated, especially among young people. Many former believers have simply turned their backs on Christianity and no longer accept its teachings. But what are those teachings?

In *The Creed*, a new film series blending documentary conversations and dynamic talks, Bishop Robert Barron guides viewers into the depths of the Nicene Creed, a fourth-century statement of faith that has profoundly influenced Christian spirituality, theology, and liturgy in both the East and West.

Explore the meaning of “belief” and whether it contradicts reason; the creative love of God the Father; the shocking mystery of his Son’s Incarnation, and the great drama of his Crucifixion and Resurrection; the life-giving power of the Spiritus Sanctus, or “holy breath,” shared between them; and the mystical reality of the Church, which calls all of humanity out of the world of sin to receive forgiveness and participate in Christ’s divinity—not only in the next world but here and now.



A Word from Joy

As we enter into this New Year, I wanted to let you know of our situation at the Holy Cross Pro-Life Group. COVID has been hard on everyone – individuals, families and parishes alike. I view our dealing with the poor of Champaign-Urbana as sacred work and indeed a miracle work, in all our years and especially during the last 5 or so. During the last 5 years we have only been donor-driven – no special collections have taken place at our church; our donors and partnerships have been fantastic. We have expanded to do local pro-life billboards, and have the Pro-Life Discussion Group and continue to shepherd 40 days and much more!

In looking at our finances, we will only have enough funds to continue as we have been for 3 or so more months. While we do distribute a HUGE amount of diapers, we also provide rent assistance, utility payments, food assistance, security deposits, car repair, car license and registrations. We have paid some insurance, transportation assistance and other items. While we knew that our response to the great need to the service of the poor was a step out in faith, we also knew taking on the families we have for the last 2 years would stretch us. But we are more than just an agency to help the poor with monetary or baby items or furniture; we provide hope to those who suffer. We help provide a tangible and loving response to those in need. Hopefully we do all these things with the love of Christ and the tenderness of Mary.

In practical terms, we will need some help. We'll be finding ways to have innovative donations at Holy Cross, and will work closely with Father Danton and Father Leo. But we need your help too. While we are based at Holy Cross, I have always considered us an area-wide entity; and we have always shared our knowledge, expertise, speakers, time and talent, and material goods with people in the community. We love our collaborations!
