EXCERPT FROM A Eucharistic Christmas: Advent Meditations on the Presence of Christ

Now What?

Where do we go to meet our Lord in his humanity as well as his divinity? Many parishes offer perpetual Adoration or set times of Adoration throughout the week. If you find that there are no Adoration opportunities near you, you can still visit with Jesus. While the term "Eucharistic Adoration" is formally used to describe prayer before the exposed Host, you can obtain the exact same graces and spiritual benefits by visiting the Lord wherever the Blessed Sacrament is reserved in a tabernacle. And that's the case in nearly every Catholic Church.

No matter how you choose to spend your time with Jesus while you sit with him, be assured that, over time, if you are faithful in your visits, your life will change. You will change. As you do, you may find it is helpful to know that, in Adoration, you're practicing an ancient form of devotion known as contemplative prayer.



Among Eucharistic adorers, the story is often told of St. John Vianney, the small, humble and holy pastor of a country parish in Ars, France, in the 1800s. Fr. Vianney, who would come to be known as the Curé of Ars, used to watch a farmer coming into the church after working the fields late each afternoon. Day after day, the farmer would kneel and pray before the Blessed Sacrament. Finally Fr. Vianney, eager to progress in

HIMANDHELOOKSATME his own prayer life, asked the farmer what it was that he was saying to God each day. "Oh, I don't say anything," the farmer told him,"I look at him, and he looks at me."

Tuition assistance scholarship grants from the endowment fund established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria **ROOTED IN FAITH** Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding, the first Bishop of Peoria, will be available for the 2024-2025 school year for students enrolled in or intending to enroll in grades Kindergarten through 12 in any Catholic school located in the Diocese of Peoria whose families are active members of a Catholic parish in the diocese. All grants will be based on financial need objectively assessed.

Information about the grants and application materials may be obtained from any Catholic elementary or secondary school in the Diocese of Peoria or on the Diocesan website <u>www.cdop.org</u> under Catholic Education and then under Financial Assistance.
