In *The Creed*, a new film series blending documentary conversations and dynamic talks, Bishop Robert Barron guides viewers into the depths of the Nicene Creed, a fourth-century statement of faith that has profoundly influenced Christian spirituality, theology, and liturgy in both the East and West.

Explore the meaning of "belief" and whether it contradicts reason; the creative love of God the Father; the shocking mystery of his Son's Incarnation, and the great drama of his Crucifixion and Resurrection; the life-giving power of the Spiritus Sanctus, or "holy breath," shared between them; and the mystical reality of the Church, which calls all of humanity out of the world of sin to receive forgiveness and participate in Christ's divinity—not only in the next world but here and now.

### A Word from Joy

This past week, we arranged thru Saint Vincent de Paul the payment of heat and water bills for a family in need. THANK YOU St. Vincent de Paul Society!

We will start our 2022 diaper ordering and delivering! As we embark on a new year, please pray for continued assistance for the Holy Cross Pro-Life work. In 2021 we: Distributed more than 38,000 diapers. Serviced at least 17 families with over 30 children in diapers/pullups; Provided rent and food assistance, and provided formula and toiletries; Arranged for Christmas for area families thru Holy Cross donations and St. Matthew School teachers and Grades 3 and 4.

We picked up and delivered gently used furniture to several families. We paid for car repairs, and for title and license; Provided travel assistance and gave gift cards to families in need. St. Vincent de Paul Society arranged Christmas meals to several of our families. Thank you!

We delivered used car seats, gently used toys, clothes and dehumidifier. We now have 3 hearing impaired families we are working with. We supplied medical supplies, housing and food for a family temporarily homeless and with the mom suffering from COVID at the same time! This was a shared effort between us and the Champaign County Regional Planning Commission! Whew! Special projects include: 40 Days for Life, Pro-Life Billboard project, Ecumenical Memorial Prayer Vigil, Pro-Life Discussion Group, Life Chain, Pro-life speakers, education and programs, and more!
