Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Although Soviet communism ended in the early 1990's, its destructive effects linger in the societies where it once ruled. Under the communist system, cultural values of charity and volunteerism disappeared. Rapid, sometimes harsh transitions to market economies led to ongoing attitudes of materialism that have left poor and dependent people—such as children, seniors, and people with disabilities—particularly vulnerable.

The Diocese of Chisinău, founded in 2000, covers all of Moldova and the unrecognized breakaway state of "Transnistria," currently occupied by Russian forces. Today the diocese contains 20 parishes and 7 charity foundations that work to meet the spiritual and material needs of the people. This spirit of love for the most poor and needy is evident in Moldova's generous response not only to the needs of its own people but also to refugees fleeing the war in Ukraine. Working in cooperation with Caritas Moldova, the diocese has expended its outreach and ability to reveal Christ's mercy to Moldova's vulnerable children and youth by establishing a network of care and support centers, where children and youth benefit from informal education programs in a safe, caring environment. The centers also help strengthen the parenting skills of mothers and fathers. With funding from the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe, the diocese and its local partners have established the centers according to standards for quality and child protection to make them safe and caring environments.



REGULATIONS FOR LENT AND EASTER TRIDUUM

The regulations for Lent and Easter Triduum follow:

Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian Year. Priests, religious and laity are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, attentiveness to prayer, and especially to works of charity and mercy.

Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, February, 22, 2023 and all the Fridays of Lent.

(Note: Because St. Patrick's Day, March 17, falls on a Friday of Lent, the bishop has granted a dispensation from the obligation to abstain from meat on this day.)

Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday, February, 22nd and Good Friday, April 7th.

On these two days of fast and abstinence, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is a serious matter.

any way needed. Equally, to inspire participants to live as disciples of Christ through serving others as a way of life; and to foster the Catholic faith of each participant through the sacraments, prayer and involvement in social service.

CHWC is an organization which coordinates summer camps across the country that bring together 350+ high schoolers, young adults, and adult leaders to form work groups who will go out into the community to serve those who serve for 4 days of a week.

Projects can be anything from cleaning, painting, building or demolishing, or landscaping and yard work; to childcare, organizing food or clothing, serving food, and visiting the elderly.

From the Desk of Principal Koerner:

If January is the month of motivation, February is the month of adjustment. When the excitement of New Year dies down, you are clearer of what really matters. You distinguish meaningful goals from lofty ones.

February, the season of Lent, is focused on returning to the embrace of God's love through repentance and sacrifice. Lent can often be perceived as a hollow ritual calling Christians to repentance (when we should be seeking Christ all year long).

However, each Christian needs time to refocus their faith on Christ and get a heart check. The season of Lent invites us to intentionally improve our relationship with God. Make no mistake, Lent is not simply giving up something like chocolate or Facebook. Lent is removing the most worldly and gluttonous aspects of our lives, so that we might fill our lives with the things like prayer, fasting, works of piety, works of mercy, and sacrificial giving. The 40 days of Lent remind us of the 40 days that Jesus spent in the desert.

Ash Wednesday, is the beginning of Lent, and we should feel a strong calling to encourage our Holy Cross community to draw closer to Jesus Christ. This is the time to confess our sins both individually and collectively, and follow Christ's pattern of giving and serving.

Did you Know? Your child can attend a Catholic School. Financial Assistance Is Available.

Tuition assistance scholarship grants from the endowment fund established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria ROOTED IN FAITH Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding, the first Bishop of Peoria, will be available for the 2023-24 school year for students enrolled in or intending to enroll in grades Kindergarten through 12 in any Catholic school located in the Diocese of Peoria whose families are active members of a Catholic parish in the diocese. All grants will be based on financial need objectively assessed.

Information about the grants and application materials may be obtained from any Catholic elementary or secondary school in the Diocese of Peoria or on the Diocesan website www.cdop.org under *Catholic *Education* and then under *Financial *Assistance. Consult the detailed protocols and procedures and checklist for all requirements needed to be eligible for an award.

Parents must apply online at: <u>online.factsmgt.com/aid</u>. Families of students currently receiving grants are reminded that all grants are for one year only, and anyone seeking to renew a grant for the 2023-24 school year must reapply.

Deadline for the completed application is **April 28, 2023.** Notification of grant awards will be made in June of 2023.

Another funding opportunity is also available due to the Invest in Kids Act legislation in Illinois. Students may be eligible for up to 100% of tuition and fees under a program for tax credit scholarships (TCS). Details on how to apply and who qualifies are available on the Empower Illinois website at www.empowerillinois.org. Students who receive a TCS are ineligible to receive a Spalding award.
