

Circumstances Accompanying the Institution of the Holy Eucharist (cont.)



Jesus Christ institutes the Holy Eucharist on the very night he was to be betrayed, and at the hour when his enemies were making ready to seize him. Before delivering himself into their hands to be crucified, he prepares for all men the repast by which they were to live his life; he establishes the sacrifice which, being intended to represent and continue that he is about to fulfill on Calvary, will remain the only true sacrifice. "While at the house of Caiphas" says St. Leo, "and while they are discussing the means of putting him to death, this loving Savior, by establishing the sacrament of his body and his blood, teaches how great is the victim that was afterwards to be offered up to God."

O prodigy of his love for us! It is at the very moment that they are preparing the instruments of his Passion that he gives the greatest proof of his goodness and munificence. Thus, O generous Savior, you reserved the most signal of your favors for that hour when you were to receive the most cruel outrages! When there are no further limits for the ingratitude and malice of men to cross, your love goes beyond the limits it had laid out for itself, and favors us with the most excellent of your gifts. Soon will the scourges inflicted at the pillar, and the nails fastening you to the cross, drain your blood; but you first fill with it the chalice you present to us in the persons of your disciples, to whom you say: "Drink ye all of this; for this is my blood of the new testament, which shall be shed for many for the remission of sins." Ah! How can we think on this prodigy of your goodness without shedding tears of love, admiration, and gratitude?

Through love he gives us all he possesses - do we through love and gratitude give ourselves wholly to him? . . . Alas! Perhaps we remain cold, insensible towards him. Let it not be so in the future. When the heart of Jesus is all fire towards us, could ours remain all ice to him? Let us enter on the path of divine love and persevere in it.



Financial Assistance Is Available.

Tuition assistance scholarship grants from the endowment fund established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria **ROOTED IN FAITH** Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding, the first Bishop of Peoria, will be available for the 2024-2025 school year for students enrolled in or intending to enroll in grades Kindergarten through 12 in any Catholic school located in the Diocese of Peoria whose families are active members of a Catholic parish in the diocese. All grants will be based on financial need objectively assessed.

Information about the grants and application materials may be obtained from any Catholic elementary or secondary school in the Diocese of Peoria or on the Diocesan website www.cdop.org under Catholic Education and then under Financial Assistance.

Consult the detailed protocols and procedures and checklist for all requirements necessary to be eligible for an award.

Parents must apply online at: online.factsmgt.com/aid. Families of students currently receiving grants are reminded that all grants are for one year only, and anyone seeking to renew a grant for the 2024-2025 school year must reapply. Deadline date for the completed application is April 26, 2024.

Notification of grant awards will be made in June of 2024.







A PLACE AT THE TABLE

There are no African-American Saints formally recognized within the Catholic Church, but that could soon change.

There are six incredible black men and women who are on the path to Canonization. The Catholic Church is starting to recognize their impact and may soon name any or all of them Saints. It's time to hear their stories.

Venerable Pierre Toussaint

Born enslaved, Toussaint gained success as a hairdresser and used his resources to serve the poor.

Servant of God Mother Mary Lange

Lange was the founder of the Oblate Sisters of Providence and the first African-American superior of any religious order.

Venerable Henriette Delille

Legally unable to join a religious order because of her African heritage, Delille started the Sisters of the Holy Family, an order that still ministers to people today.

Venerable Fr. Augustus Tolton

Tolton escaped slavery and traveled to Rome to become ordained. He was the first African-American priest in the United States.

Servant of God Julia Greeley

Greeley was an enslaved woman who became free, converted to Catholicism, and consecrated her life to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Servant of God Sr. Thea Bowman

Bowman converted to Catholicism as a child, became a nun, and spent her life singing, teaching, and preaching to promote devotion to Christ.
