# A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN (2:13-25)

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, Zeal for your house will consume me. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple to his body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.

While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well.

### FROM PRINCIPAL GREG KOERNER:

The 40-day period of Lent is based on two episodes of spiritual testing in the Bible: the 40 years of wilderness wanderings by the Israelites after the exodus from Egypt, and the Temptation of Jesus while he spent 40 days fasting in the wilderness.

In the Bible, the number 40 holds special significance in the measurement of time, and many other important events revolve around it. During the flood, it rained for 40 days and 40 nights, Moses fasted on the mountain for 40 days and nights before God gave the Ten Commandments, and the prophet Elijah traveled for 40 days and nights to reach the mountain of God in Sinai.

How are you going to spend your 40 days? The school is spending its 40 days by giving the students and staff the opportunity for reconciliation on Monday mornings, attending Mass on Fridays, doing Stations of the Cross every Friday after Mass, and giving some classrooms the opportunity to attend adoration. Some of our 7th and 8th grade students will be performing a Living Stations of the Cross during the school day sometime after spring break.

With spring break just around the corner, I still would like to ask all of you to practice social distancing, continue to wear a mask, and sanitize your hands. Please stay safe and take care of one another.




EVERYDAY HEROES Heroism isn't restricted to decorated soldiers or persecuted saints. It's something achievable for all of us even
