BULLETIN DEADLINE: Two Wednesdays prior to the bulletin in which the information will be posted.



SOLEMNITY OF ST. JOSEPH

Everyone knows March 17 is St. Patrick's Day, but did you know March 19 is St. Joseph's Day? In fact, March 19 is so important, that despite falling within the season of Lent, the Mass of the day has us sing

the Gloria and the priest wears white or gold rather than the usual Lenten purple. In many countries of the world it is even a Holy Day of Obligation. Why so important? Because there was no man who ever lived who was closer to Jesus than St. Joseph!

As such, Holy Cross will be celebrating a Solemn sung Mass at 5:30 p.m. on March 19 with incense to honor St. Joseph, the foster-father of Jesus and spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Everyone is invited! St. Joseph Day is a particularly festive day in Italy where it remains a major day of celebration. In the spirit of the day, after the Mass at roughly 6:30, the Catholic Daughters of America will host a meal in the Holy Cross parish hall. There will be a traditional St. Joseph Altar, a presentation on St. Joseph, and lasagna will be the main course.

You do not have to be present to win. Proceeds will go to Holy Cross School.


