# Eucharistic Revival 😽

#### Excerpt from:

Meditations on the Holy Eucharist by Brother Philippe Institution of the Holy Eucharist (cont.)

The adorable Savior takes bread unto his holy and venerable hands, and having raised his eyes to heaven, to God his Father, he returns thanks: teaching us thereby that he is about to establish the true sacrifice of thanksgiving, that by which alone the Father can be worthily thanked for all his favors to us.

When he said: "This is my body," Jesus changed all the substance of the bread he held in his hands into the substance of his body, - that same holy body which, born of the Virgin Mary, was to be delivered up to death for us. When he said: "This is my blood," he changed in the same manner all the wine which was in the chalice into his blood, - that same blood which he was to shed for the remission of sins.

Behold how he gave himself to his apostles to be their spiritual food, and the life of their souls. Now, as it was not for them alone that he instituted the Holy Eucharist, but for the whole human race, he appointed them priests of the new law, and commanded them to do what he had done for a commemoration of him. Thus all the faithful of all times may participate in this divine banquet, and feed on the living bread come down from heaven.

The apostles, after having adored the body and blood of Jesus Christ beneath the sacramental veils, receive them from his hands, nourish themselves with them, and first relish the sweetness of the bread of angels. They all participate in the divine banquet their adorable Master prepared for them, and by which he feeds and strengthens their souls, and makes them live by his own life.

Let us assist at Mass and approach to Communion with the dispositions of the faithful apostles at the last supper, when they received into their hearts the body and blood of Jesus Christ. Let us go to the holy table with St. Peter's faith and St. John's love, so as to participate abundantly in all the graces of that sacrament of faith and love.

# PALM SUNDAY THE PASSION OF THE LORD

#### PALM SUNDAY (Year B)

This Sunday we find ourselves at a crossroads. As we approach the great mystery of Christ's Death and Resurrection, we are

coming to the end of our Lenten journey. It is a time to both look back and reflect, and to look forward and prepare.

Holy Week is a unique time in the Church calendar where we are suddenly walking minute by minute with Jesus as he goes through his Passion, Death, and Resurrection. Starting today with Palm Sunday, we enter into Jesus's life in "real time." The way God works in time during this

week can really help us to enter into friendship with Jesus as we walk with him in his sufferings.



### A BIBLE STUDY ON THE ANNUNCIATION

Dr. Ben Akers, associate professor of

Graduate School, leads us through a brief reflection on the scene of the Annunciation in Luke 1:26-38. He engages the scripture verses line by line highlighting some of the key Old Testament passages evoked by the angel Gabriel's words. The reflection concludes with some thoughts on how we can imitate Mary's "yes" to the Lord in our own life, especially in this time of suffering.



# HOLY WEEK IN ROME: A JOURNEY WITH THE POPE

See how Holy Week is commemorated in Rome. Hear from theologians, professors, art historians,
