It is estimated that in every second of the day and night four elevations of the Host take place.



And I, if I be lifted up, will draw all men to me.



A Word from Joy

We found out about 3 saves – two the day of the Divine Mercy! Praise God! A couple from Holy Cross pray at the Equity Clinic nearly every Sunday after the 10 a.m. Mass. On April 7, they had two abortion-minded women leave without having their abortions. One of those women was from Indiana. We encourage people to come out to pray and if possible be prepared to pass out information to help give them help – about the abortion pill reversal, Crisis Pregnancy Centers, and even help to leave the abortion business... Please consider coming out to the clinics to pray and have a peaceful presence.

Financial Assistance request: we have a request from a single mother whose ex-husband has been unable to meet his financial obligations. She is seriously behind on her electric bill and has other difficulties. Ongoing SVdP came through with a one-time \$150 donation to help out. This mom was able to get the utility bill put on a payment plan and she is working on having the Salvation Army put a matching gift toward her bill (and we will provide the initial amount they can match). We are still waiting for this. New: this woman's ex-husband is seriously ill with cancer. Please keep this man and both families in your prayers. We stand at the ready to help out with bills as needed. Thank you.
