# Eucharistic Revival

"Why, then, is our Savior so patient amid so many outrages? Is He not free to act as He pleases? Is He forced to remain with us in the Blessed Sacrament? Yes, He is forced. He does indeed sometimes vindicate His honor and visit irreverence with exemplary punishment, but there is one point to which his anger never goes: He will never take back the gift of his love. Men may do what they will, but the desire of Jesus Christ to be united with us will always force Him to remain in the Blessed Sacrament. This is the secret of Our Lord's endurance. He endures all things for the sake of the elect."

"I was naked' in the Blessed Sacrament, stripped of My glory, and your faith, reverence and devotion supplies what was wanting to My Majesty; I was 'imprisoned' in the form of bread and wine, and 'sick' with love for you, and you did lovingly visit Me and refresh Me; I was a 'stranger,' unknown to the greater part of mankind, and you gave Me your heart for My abode; I was 'hungry' and 'thirsty,' consumed with the desire of possessing your affections entirely, and you satisfied My desire to the upmost.
