Baptism: Second and fourth Sunday of the month, after the 10:00 a.m. Mass. Parents must be registered members and attend a baptismal preparation session, preferably before the birth of the child. Contact the Parish Office 3 months in advance to schedule.
MATRIMONY: Couples contemplating marriage should call the Office at least 8 months in advance. At least one partner must be a registered parishioner at Holy Cross and be actively practicing the faith. If you have had a previous marriage, set no marriage date until you have discussed this with your Pastor.

## The End of Roe?

While the final decision has not been made, with a startling breach of confidentiality, a draft of the majority decision from the U.S. Supreme Court was leaked. The reporting has been dreadful. This decision is not final, and if it was:

1. Abortion will still continue in the U.S.
2. The matter goes back to the states, where certain laws will trigger to either codify abortion in that particular state or banish or stipulate specific abortion restrictions.
3. This case only involves abortion-no other items or issues regarding privacy because abortion is a unique thing-intended to end young human life.
What I do know is that our work will be needed even more-and EVERY church should pray about how they can respond to the need of women and families in crisis.
It's been my experience that women will entertain allowing that pre-born baby to continue living if: she has someone who believes in her and she can see concrete hope and help. It's a change of heart from fear or sorrow to be filled with hope instead.
Please think about how YOU and YOUR FAMILY can help others-is it with time? Babysitting? Donations of goods or money? Are you willing to make meals? Provide a new car seat or booster? Help a mother learn new skills? You decide! Every little bit helps. Let's be part of the loving solution!
