Eucharistic Revival

THE MIRACLE OF AVIGNON, FRANCE

After Louis VIII, King of France, succeeded in getting rid of the Albigensian heresy, which denied the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, a great procession of the Holy Eucharist was planned. On September 14, 1226, the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, this great procession took place in the streets of Avignon ending in the new chapel which had been built in honor of the Holy Cross.

The King and a crowd of faithful people waited at the chapel as the Bishop carried the Blessed Sacrament throughout the city. Due to their devotion the Blessed Sacrament remained exposed all night and remained exposed for many days. Eventually, the Bishop decided the Blessed Sacrament should remain perpetually exposed. This continued for more than 200 years.

In late November 1433, the chapel in Avignon was threatened with flooding waters. Everyone feared that the chapel containing the Blessed Sacrament would be flooded. Taking a boat to get to the doors of the chapel, they witnessed a miracle as the doors to the chapel were opened. The water had parted just like the Red Sea. In front of them was a dry path from the doors to the altar. On both sides a wall of water stood four feet high. The water had not touched any of the papers, books, cloths, towels, or reliquaries stored under the altar.

On December 1 the waters began to recede. Many crowds came to witness that everything under the altar was dry. Devotion to the Blessed Sacrament increased among the people. Every year after, they observed a special feast on the day of that miracle, November 30. This continued until 1793 when the chapel was destroyed at the height of the French Revolution.

After the end of the French Revolution, a chapel was rebuilt and the Bishop of Avignon established it again as a Perpetual Adoration Chapel, which continues to the present day.

FATHER LEO'S TANZANIA WELL PROJECT

Father Leo is raising funds to support the drilling of a well to provide a dedicated local source of clean drinking water to the Kiziramuyaga Primary School in his village in Tanzania. The school serves 900 students and staff, as well as the surrounding community.

The lack of nearby clean water means women and girls spend many hours each day walking long distances to carry buckets of water back to the school and village. The cost of the project including drilling, installation of pipes & pump, construction of a reservoir water tank, and solar panel installation to power the pump is approximately \$25,000.

To date, our SVdP conference has raised half of this amount from a small group of parishioners at Holy Cross and St. Matthew. If you would like to help, please make your check payable to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul and include "Tanzania Well Project" in the memo portion of the check.
