Sacred Heart of O Sacred Heart of Jesus, I adore Yesus you in the oneness of the second person of the Holy Trinity. Whatever belongs to the person of Jesus is to be worshipped with that one and

the same worship which we pay to Jesus. He did not take on himself his human nature as something distinct and separate from himself, but as simply, absolutely, eternally his.

I worship you, O Heart of Jesus. You are the heart of the Most High made man. In worshipping you, I worship my incarnate God, Emmanuel. I worship you, as bearing a part in that passion which is my life, for you burst and broke, through agony, in the Garden of Gethsemane, and your precious contents trickled out, through the veins and pores of the skin, upon the earth. And again, you had been drained all but dry upon the Cross; and then, after death, you were pierced by the lance and gave out the small remains of that inestimable treasure, which is our redemption.

My God, my Savior, I adore your Sacred Heart, for that heart is the seat and source of all your tender human affections for us sinners. It is the instrument and organ of your love. It beat for us. It yearned over us. It ached for us and for our salvation. It was on fire through zeal, that the glory of God might be manifested in and by us. It is the channel through which has come to us all your overflowing human affection, all your divine charity toward us. All your incomprehensible compassion for us, as God and Man, as our Creator and our Redeemer and Judge, has come to us, and comes, in one inseparably mingled stream, through that Sacred Heart.

O most sacred, most loving Heart of Jesus, you are concealed in the Holy Eucharist, and you beat for us still. I worship you then with all my best love and awe, with my fervent affection, with my most subdued, most resolved will. O my God, when you condescend to suffer me to receive you, to eat and drink you, and you for a while take up your abode within me, make my heart beat with your heart. Purify it of all that is earthly, all that is proud and sensual, all that is hard and cruel, of all perversity, of all disorder, of all deadness. So fill it with you, that neither the events of the day nor the circumstances of the time may have power to ruffle it but that in your love and your fear it may have peace.


As you may know, Empower Illinois has gone away. What this means is that some of our students might not have the opportunity to attend Holy Cross. These students have relied on the scholarships they received from the state to attend Holy Cross. Last year out of the generosity of your hearts we were able to fund 40 students. Please continue to support our tuition assistances program so we can continue to grow our school.

We have one big ticket item that needs to be addressed. The school roof needs to be replaced. The current roof is 24 years old and leaks. We have been patching it over the years and we will patch it again this summer. The current roof is out of warranty and needs to be replaced. We have received two quotes and the cost is \$260,000. Please consider donating toward this much needed project.

Our Back-to-School open house is scheduled for August 13th from 4 to 8 p.m. This is a great opportunity for students to meet their teachers and to drop off supplies. There will be food trucks available for parents to purchase food for their families. Our official first day of school will be a half day on August 14th.

New: we have a mom who is a parishioner at a local parish who is a victim of domestic violence. She needed to leave her home with the police assistance, and has had to start over with virtually nothing. She is now working at a new position and has an apartment for her and her youngadult daughter. There is also another adult daughter who is living in the Chicago area. They are all traumatized. This situation of DV was going on for a long time, and of course hidden from the other family members and the public. We are looking for home items for her: 2 chests of drawers so they can have a place to put their clothes, dishes, silverware, glasses, a broom or vacuum, clothes hangers, a small set of drawers to put towels in the bath room, laundry basket and probably more. We are looking for those items now. We are also anticipating that sometime soon they may need some financial assistance.

New: We had a great response from the mom's groups at Holy Cross, St. Patrick and St. Matthew. I am so grateful and happy. This Mom knows there are good people in the world and people care for her and her family. That is so beautiful and our pleasure and our marching orders to love one another!
