His certainty that the Eucharist has the power to transform hearts led him often to say: "The more often we receive the Eucharist, the more

we become like Jesus and the more we get a foretaste of heaven!" The ability to imitate the Master is indeed one of the principal fruits of participating in Communion with his Body and Blood. Carlo understood this from a very young age, and it became a principal part of his daily life. The closer we draw to the Eucharist, the more we are transformed by it, because the presence of Christ transforms the "old man" into the "new man;" and the latter can set the world on fire with the flame of charity.

Carlo's way of living gave flesh to the words of the martyr Saint Ignatius of Antioch, who in a letter to the Philadelphians called the Eucharist "the medicine for immortality and the antidote against death so that we may always live with Jesus

Carlo was always moved by the words Jesus left us in the Gospel of Matthew: "I am with you always, to the close of the age" (Mt 28:20). The certainty of God's presence among us was a source of tremendous consolation for Carlo. "We can find God in his Body, Soul, and Divinity present in all the tabernacles of the world! If we think about it, we are much more fortunate than those who met Jesus on this earth two thousand years ago. because we have God 'really and substantially' with us always. It is enough to visit a nearby church. 'Jerusalem' is in every church! No room for despair! God is always with us and will never abandon us. How can people grasp this truth? Throngs of people stand in interminable lines to buy tickets to rock concerts or soccer matches, but I don't see crowds of people lined up outside church waiting to see Jesus in the Eucharist. This should make us pause and reflect. Perhaps people really haven't yet understood! Jesus is present among us in his very Body just as he was during his mortal life among his friends. If we reflected on this seriously, we would never leave him alone in the tabernacles waiting for us with love, wanting Eucharistic Revival to help us and to support us on our earthly journey."

FATHER LEO'S TANZANIA WELL PROJECT

Father Leo is raising funds to support the drilling of a well to provide a dedicated local source of clean drinking water to the Kiziramuyaga Primary School in his village in Tanzania. The school serves 900 students and staff, as well as the surrounding community.

The lack of nearby clean water means women and girls spend many hours each day walking long distances to carry buckets of water back to the school and village. The cost of the project including drilling, installation of pipes & pump, construction of a reservoir water tank, and solar panel installation to power the pump is approximately \$25,000.

To date, our SVdP conference has raised half of this amount from a small group of parishioners at Holy Cross and St. Matthew. If you would like to help, please make your check payable to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul and include "Tanzania Well Project" in the memo portion of the check. Checks can be mailed to the Holy Cross Church office or dropped in the collection basket.




