THE MIRACLE OF SANTAREM

Early in the 13th century in the village of Santarem, Portugal, a poor woman lived who was miserable due to her unfaithful husband. She sought out the help of a sorceress who promised to help if the poor woman would pay her with a consecrated Host. After much deliberation, the woman agreed.

She went to Mass at the church of St. Stephen. After receiving communion, she immediately took the Host from her mouth and put it in her veil. Fairly soon after that, blood began to drip. There was so much blood that it began dripping from the veil and attracted the attention of the people around her. Thinking she was injured, people offered to help her. She managed to get away from them and ran home leaving a trail of blood.

She then hid the veil and the Host in a wooden chest in her home. That night a mysterious light coming from the wooden chest began to light up the entire home. It was then that she revealed what had happened to her husband. The woman and her husband knelt in adoration the rest of the night.

Early the next morning they called the parish priest who took the Host in a procession back to the church. The Host was encased in wax and placed in the tabernacle. Later, when the tabernacle was opened another miracle occurred. The encased wax was broken into pieces and the Host was found in a crystal pyx.

This was eventually placed in a beautiful monstrance where it remains to this day on display for pilgrims to see. St. Stephen's was renamed The Church of the Holy Miracle.

FATHER LEO'S TANZANIA WELL PROJECT

Father Leo is raising funds to support the drilling of a well to provide a dedicated local source of clean drinking water to the Kiziramuyaga Primary School in his village in Tanzania. The school serves 900 students and staff, as well as the surrounding community.

The lack of nearby clean water means women and girls spend many hours each day walking long distances to carry buckets of water back to the school and village. The cost of the project including drilling, installation of pipes & pump, construction of a reservoir water tank, and solar panel installation to power the pump is approximately \$25,000.

To date, our SVdP conference has raised half of this amount from a small group of parishioners at Holy Cross and St. Matthew. If you would like to help, please make your check payable to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul and include "Tanzania Well Project" in the memo portion of the check. Checks can be mailed to the Holy Cross Church office or dropped in the collection basket.





SAINT MARIA GORETTI: FOURTEEN FLOWERS OF PARDON

This is the true story of a young virgin's ultimate act of love. On her deathbed, 11-year-old Maria Goretti forgave Alessandro Serenelli, the man who mortally

stabbed her because she resisted his attempted rape. Alessandro was sentenced to 30 years in prison for murdering Maria, and after 8 years in jail, he had no remorse. But he eventually converted after Maria miraculously appeared to him in a dream.

Shot on location in Italy, this moving account takes you on a historic and poignant journey through the life, martyrdom, and canonization of the Roman Catholic Church's youngest saint, Maria Goretti. Maria's life and martyrdom in Italy's Pontine swamps at the beginning of this century comes to life through historic photographs, interviews with her mother, and never-seen-before film footage of the canonization ceremony.
