

RCIA The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is established for the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the Sacraments of Initiation - Baptism, Confirmation, and Rite of Christian Initiation the Eucharist. This process also



for Adults

involves a parish community experiencing a renewal of faith as it welcomes new members into the Church.

The Rite speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey" centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church He founded. This journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time to bring about community and commitment to liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful.

RCIA is a restoration of the ancient catechumenate, arising within the first three centuries following the era of the apostles. It was the early Church's way of Christianizing the pagan Roman Empire. The Second Vatican Council called for the restoration and use of this venerable and powerful method of initiation for the worldwide Church.

RCIA is for:

•Individuals who are not Catholic who know they want to join the Church or who may be interested but need more information

•Catholics who have never received the sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation

•Married couples of mixed religious faiths who wish to unite their religious practice in Catholicism

ATTENTION: Parking Lot Changes

Upgrades to the school playground will begin soon. A security fence will be installed surrounding the construction area.

This will temporarily eliminate the Prairie St. exit and restrict access to the sidewalks on that corner of the block. The fenced-in area will extend halfway into the playground parking lot, changing the amount of available parking in this lot.

As a result, the remainder of the **playground parking lot** will be reserved for those needing access to the handicap ramp. Since White St. will be the only access to this lot, we ask that you follow the instructions of the parking lot attendants upon entering.

This construction project will also affect use of the **parish center parking lot**. During the weekdays, this lot will be closed to the public with parking available for staff only. On school days, this lot will be needed for drop-off and pick-up as well as activity space for our students. This lot will be available to parishioners on the weekends.
