

TASTE AND SEE



I like my name—David. Why? I think of King David, the greatest king of Israel, and whom God called "a man after my own heart." I like that.

Now, David was far from being perfect. In fact, he committed some pretty serious sins, like adultery and murder. Still, he was a man after God's own heart. How so?

First, David had absolute faith in God. Nowhere in Scripture is this point better illustrated than in 1 Samuel 17 where David as a young shepherd boy fearlessly slew the giant Philistine, Goliath. David knew he acted within the covenant of the Lord, and was fully aware that God was in control of his life. He had faith that God would deliver him from impending danger.

Second, David absolutely loved God's law. Of the 150 psalms in the Bible, David is credited for writing over half of them. Writing at various and often troubling times in his life, David repeatedly mentioned how much he loved God's perfect Word.

Third, David was truly thankful. His life was marked by seasons of great peace and prosperity as well as times of fear and despair. But through all of the seasons in his life, he never forgot to thank the Lord for everything that he had.

Fourth, David was truly repentant. He did not deny his sinfulness. He fully admitted his guilt and sought the Lord's mercy.

At every Mass we have a responsorial psalm after the first reading. King David is credited for writing over half of the 150 psalms—which are actually prayers to Almighty God. David wrote: "Taste and see the goodness of the Lord."

What did the man after God's own heart mean by that? He meant: experience God and you will enjoy His happiness.

Biblically, to "taste" is literally to perceive by experiencing. It involves a conscious decision to be involved. "Tasting God" means taking Him at His word. It means to follow His word. It means to trust in God.

When we "taste God," we will see, according to David, that the Lord is good.

David knew what he was talking about. When he was tasting and seeing and trusting, he was among the most blessedly happy of men. When he got away from God and trusted in his own ways, his own strength and desires, he became the most miserable wretch on the planet. In the psalms, he wrote about being incredibly blessed, and also expressed the emptiness of having forfeited the presence of God's Holy Spirit.

David was completely open and honest before God. We could learn from the only man the Bible calls "a man after God's own heart."


