

THE EUCHARIST AND THE BREAD OF LIFE DISCOURSE Part 3



When Jesus refers to Himself as a vine.

or a door, or any other metaphor, no one is offended, has trouble understanding, or leaves Him. It is only when He says they must eat of His flesh that many are shocked and compelled to abandon Him. This tells us that the disciples understood Jesus to be speaking literally and not figuratively.

Further, we know that Jesus was speaking literally based on the vocabulary John uses in the discourse. In the original Greek, John first used the word *phago* which is a word to describe eating in a general sense. The second time, he changes the word to *trogon* which translates to "to chew" or "to gnaw." The change to a stronger verb indicates an emphasis on making the command unambiguous as to what Jesus intends to mean here. Again, many of Jesus' followers understood the intention of the words He was using and found it so difficult to accept that they chose to abandon Him.

He then turns to His twelve Apostles and asks if they will leave Him too. Peter answered Him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God" (John 6:69). The Apostles were able to accept the very hard teaching of the bread of life as the literal Body of Christ because they had faith in Jesus. We, too, are called to this level of faith, where we believe because He says it is so. He has the words of eternal life and we have nowhere else to go.

Mass times: Wednesday 6:00 p.m. Vigil, Thursday at 8:15 a.m. and 12:10 p.m.




OCIA - The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is established for the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the Sacraments of Initiation -Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. This process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal of faith as it welcomes new members into the Church.

The Order speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey" centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church He founded. This journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time to bring about community and commitment to liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful.

OCIA is a restoration of the ancient catechumenate, arising within the first three centuries following the era of the apostles. It was the early Church's way of Christianizing the pagan Roman Empire. The Second Vatican Council called for the restoration and use of this venerable and powerful method of initiation for the worldwide Church. OCIA is for:

- Individuals who are not Catholic who know they want to join the Church or who may be interested but need more information
- Catholics who have never received the sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation
- Married couples of mixed religious faiths who wish to unite their religious practice in Catholicism

I welcome and value your positive energy and dedication to excellence in education, and I look forward to working with you and your children.

Drop OFF

Drop-off will remain the same. Drop-off will begin at 7:40 and end at 8:00. We are keeping it the same because it has cut down on the amount of tardiness, and teachers can start classes promptly at 8:05. We will be sending out an email on how this will look and what door you will be assigned to for drop-off.
