AUGUST 26TH & 27TH MISSION APPEAL TO SUPPORT THE DIOCESE OF RULENGE-NGARA IN TANZANIA, EAST AFRICA



Holy Cross will be conducting its annual Mission Appeal to support the Diocese of Rulenge-Ngara in Tanzania, East Africa. This diocese is located in the northwestern part of Tanzania; it serves a population of over a million people. This includes 334,000 Catholics and 30 parishes. Many of these people live on an income of under \$1 a day and survive on only one meal a day. The hardships they face include a lack of clean and safe water, lack of funds to train seminarians, and a lack of funds to support children in the Orphanage Centre. Any funds we can provide will help them drill and construct two wells and three water reservoirs (\$15,000 per well), contribute to the tuition of seminarians (\$2,000 per seminarian), and support the construction of the maternity ward for women and their babies. Bishop Severine NIWEMUGIZI of the Rulenge-Ngara Diocese extends his deepest gratitude for any spiritual or financial support you can provide.



THE MAN OF THE SHROUD EXHIBIT

There is a replica of the shroud of Turin that is coming in September to Vandalia, IL. You are invited to see a replica of the Shroud of Turin, which is believed by many to be the burial cloth of Jesus, and to learn about the history and science behind it by experiencing *The Man of the Shroud* Exhibit, coming to Mother of Dolors Parish in Vandalia for display Sept. 8-14.

The Center for the Study of the Passion of the Christ and the Holy Shroud has developed a moving and informative mobile exhibit on the Shroud of Turin. The centerpiece is a full-length canvas replica of the Shroud made by the Shroud of Turin Education and Research Association, Inc. In addition, the mobile exhibit contains a large, crucified corpus showing the wounds of Christ corresponding to the passion narrative in the Gospel accounts and the wounds shown on the Shroud. The exhibit contains over 31 pop-up display banners detailing the history and science of the Shroud.

To check it out, visit Mother of Dolors Parish Center at 705 N. St. Clair St., Vandalia, IL 62471. There is no charge, and it's open to the public. (This is only about 2 hours, or less, south of Champaign-Urbana.)

Tree of Life | Themes | The Bible Project: In the opening pages of the Bible, God gives humanity a gift that they quickly forfeit—

eternal life that comes by eating from the tree of life. In this video, we explore the meaning of this powerful image and how sacred trees play a key role throughout the story of the Bible. It all leads up to Jesus himself, who died upon a tree so that he could become a new tree of life for all humanity.



In the beginning of the Bible, God transforms a desolate wilderness into a garden through a

stream that waters the ground and brings life wherever it goes. This image gets developed throughout the biblical story as wells, cisterns, rain, and rivers all become images of God's creative power. In this video, we'll explore the "water of life" theme through the biblical story and see how it leads to Jesus, who presents himself as the one bringing living water to a world that is desperately thirsty.



Eternal Life | Themes | The Bible Project: Jesus offered people eternal life. But what Jesus offered people eternal lile. Dut what does that mean? Explore the meaning of a

phrase that invites us into God's life now and in the age to come.



The Holy Spirit | Themes | The Bible Project: In this video, we explore the original meaning of the biblical concept of "spirit" and

what it means that God's Spirit is personally present in all of creation. Ultimately, the Spirit was revealed through Jesus and sent out into the lives of his followers to bring about the new creation.
