


Church of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross







Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are invited in scripture to "sing to the Lord a new song" (Psalm 96) and "clap your hands, shout to God with cries of joy" (Psalm 47), to

"blow the trumpet" (Joel 2) at feasts and solemnities and to "come before [God] with joyful songs" (Psalm 100).

Music has been integral to the expression of faith in this parish since its founding—and continues to this day. If able, you can and are encouraged to be an active participant in that expression! We have many opportunities beyond congregational singing for those who wish to engage more fully in the musical life of Holy Cross.

- The traditional choir rehearses Thursday nights 7-8 p.m. in the choir loft, and sings at the 10 a.m. Mass during the school year. This choir sings sacred music spanning more than 1,000 years, from Gregorian chant to modern choral repertoire.
- The contemporary choir rehearses Tuesday nights 7-8 p.m. in the choir loft, and sings at the 4 p.m. Mass during the school year. This choir focuses on newer hymns and praise songs.
- Cantors lead the congregational singing at all Masses and proclaim the psalm and Gospel verse. Cantors are an integral part of the music program at Holy Cross.
- Guest instrumentalists contribute their skills at special Masses throughout the year. While these are often members of the Champaign-Urbana community, parishioners who play a musical instrument may contribute their talents as well.

Participation in the music program at Holy Cross is more than a stewardship opportunity; we are a friendly group with lots of camaraderie. We welcome all who wish to participate with friendship and grace, Holy Cross members or not! Additionally, if you want to join us for a particular season, such as Advent/Christmas or Easter, you are most welcome.

On a different note, I am saddened that we had to say goodbye to 20 of our students who could not afford to continue at Holy Cross. With the Invest in Kids Act gone and not enough money in our scholarship fund, these students could no longer receive a Catholic education. Please consider giving what you can to our scholarship fund so we do not have to say goodbye to any more of our students. To break it down in real terms, 20 students at \$8,200 per student for tuition is a \$164,000 loss of income for our school and for student engagement, growth and spirituality.
