

### THE RUBBER MUST HIT THE ROAD

A man was coming out of church one day, and the pastor was standing at the door as he always did to shake hands. He grabbed the guy by the hand and pulled him aside, and said to him: "Hey, brother, you need to join the Army of the Lord!" The man replied, "I'm already in the Army of the Lord, preacher." The pastor said, "How come I don't see you except at Christmas and Easter?" The man whispered back, "I'm in the secret service."

Here's news for you: There's no secret service in the service of the Lord. Faith is shown in our actions—not secretively, but openly (check Matthew 5:16). When it comes to being a true believer, "the rubber must hit the road."

Our beliefs need to influence our actions to be taken seriously. If you don't act upon your beliefs, then you probably don't really believe. When Elijah stood on the mountaintop and called for God to send down fire to prove himself to the people, we know that Elijah believed that God could do this. When Peter told the man on the side of the road to get up and walk instead of giving him money, we know that Peter believed God could heal this man. For both of these as well as people throughout the Bible, belief is shown by action.

St. James makes it clear that we can "claim" to believe in all kinds of wonderful "ideals," but if we don't put what we "supposedly believe" into action...if we don't apply it to our daily lives...if we don't allow it to transform us from the inside out... that faith is as good as dead.

God has a plan for the building of His Kingdom here on earth. Jesus inaugurated it and set it in motion, and now Christians are to address the issues of peace and justice, the issues of helping the poor, the sick, the hungry, defending human life, promoting morality. We are to allow God to work through us to accomplish God's good plan for this world and for how we are to live our lives. And there is no plan B.

Alexander Graham Bell was an amazingly talented person. His inventions are connected to things we use every day—like the telegraph, the audiometer, the tricycle landing gear you find on planes, and a host of other lesser-known machines. The most famous of all his inventions was the telephone. It also made his family and his descendants very wealthy. But he almost lost it all. You see, Bell never got around to submitting a patent application.

Finally, his father-in-law, who had financed a lot of the research, got so impatient that he filed the patent on Bell's behalf on the 14th of February 1876, Bell's 29th birthday. And it was a good thing he did, because just a few hours later, another scientist by the name of Elisha Gray went to the patent office to get a patent on a machine he'd been working on for many years—you guessed it, the telephone.

This story reminds us that sometimes it's not enough simply to have great ideas. We need to act on them. Bell and his father-in-law are a good example of the relationship between faith and works. Bell had faith in his telephone but did nothing about it. His father-in-law had faith and works to go with it. A Christian's faith is to spur him or her into Christian action.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Set out into the deep." These were Christ's words to St. Peter before the fisherman-turned-apostle hauled in a great catch of fish. In awe at the abundant gift of the Lord, and consoled by his mercy, Peter and the other apostles accepted Christ's invitation and became "fishers of men." After three years of intimate friendship with Jesus and personally witnessing his death and resurrection, they were sent out to preach the Gospel, baptize, forgive sins, and celebrate the Eucharist. Their lives were wholly dedicated to saving souls.

In every age the Church is in need of men who give themselves totally to the service of Christ's salvific mission in the priesthood. Please continue your support and keep the members of St. Vincent de Paul Society and those they help in your prayers. Our donation poor box is in the vestibule of the Church.


