

Eucharistic Revival



Dear Friends,

The latter weeks of Ordinary time tend to focus on the different requirements for belonging in the Kingdom of God. Whether Jesus gives us a direct teaching on the commandments, urges us to forgive, or tells us parables, He continually invites us to reflect on how our personal lives are

measuring up to His demands of discipleship. These are demands personally delivered by the Son of God who died for you and me!

I often think about the people who come to me sharing their struggle to believe in God's love for them. Whether these doubts stem from personal sin, brokenness, or both, they become a barrier to the hope of sharing eternal joy with God forever in heaven. What makes it possible to believe in this unconditional love of God, regardless of our fear and failures? The loving gaze of Jesus.

During Mass or in the quiet presence of the Blessed Sacrament, God is truly present, and I know His love is for you and me. The more time we spend in the presence of the Eucharist, the more that "knowing" moves from head to heart. The "longest journey" (head to heart) is expedited by something profound and totally free: the merciful love of Jesus! The only "cost" is a humble, contrite heart.

On August 15, we celebrated the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In the mystery of the Assumption, we see Mary, the Mother of God, experience the fulfillment of the love she received from God by being united with Him — body and soul — forever in heaven. Her glory in heaven right now is a sign of hope for our future glory, if only we are open to the same love that filled her heart!

Won't you join me during these final weeks of Ordinary time and let the loving gaze of Jesus fall upon that part of your heart in most need of mercy or healing? Make an act of contrition, go to confession — be set free! Through His Paschal Mystery, Jesus has conquered sin and death. He is thirsting to give you and me the fullness of life in the Kingdom of Heaven — which begins in this life through our communion with Christ and His Mystical Body. Just say yes!

WELCOME FR. DEOGRATIAS MPEWO



"I am Rev. Fr Deogratias Mpewo, from the Catholic Diocese of Jinja, Uganda, East Africa. I was born on 3rd/June/1965 to Boniface and Anastasia, both passed on same day August 02 1998; may their souls rest in eternal Glory. My father was an elementary school teacher and my mother a housewife.

We were born 11 children, 5 girls, 6 boys and I am 4th number.

I was ordained on 18/February/1995 by the first Bishop of the Diocese, Rt Rev Joseph Willigers, Mill Hill Missionary, MHSRIEP. The Diocese was erected in 1964 but received the first Bishop in 1967 and he handed over to the present Bishop in 2010. I started my priestly vocation in 1981 in Uganda Martyrs Minor Seminary which was opened in 1980 with 11 students; I became a priest, we joined 18 students and two of us were ordained priests.

I love working in Holy Cross Catholic Parish because of the warm welcome I am receiving every day from the parishioners ever since they received the news of my appointment as Parochial Vicar. God bless you all.



HAWAIIAN DAY AT HOLY CROSS SCHOOL


