A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

21:28-32

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: "What is your opinion? A man had two sons. He came to the first and said, 'Son, go out and work in the vineyard today.' He said in reply, 'I will not,' but afterward changed his mind and went. The man came to the other son and gave the same order. He said in reply, 'Yes, sir,' but did not go. Which of the two did his father's will?" They answered, "The first." Jesus said to them, "Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you. When John came to you in the way of righteousness, you did not believe him; but tax collectors and prostitutes did. Yet even when you saw that, you did not later change your minds and believe him."

A READING FROM THE LETTER OF ST PAUL TO THE PHILIPPIANS

Brothers and Sisters: If there is any encouragement in Christ, any solace in love, any participation in the Spirit, any compassion and mercy, complete my joy by being of the same mind, with the same love, united in heart, thinking one thing. Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves, each looking out not for his own interests, but also for those of others.

Have in you the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.



We are finishing up another full week of school! Much is different this year but we are figuring it out and getting back into the swing of things! We currently have 190 in-person students and 44 virtual students. We have one teacher per grade for Pre-3 through 5th, and two teachers per grade for 6th-8th. We have a full time music/band teacher, a school librarian, and a part-time Spanish teacher. Our teachers have their hands full teaching both in person and virtually. Lots of technology is in use!

Thanks to the generosity of several donors, we have an order of chrome books for our older students and new laptops for our teachers arriving soon. We continue to serve hot lunch daily and send lunches home to any virtual students who request it. We are pleased to have several new Holy Cross School families this year. With the start of the school year comes an additional live streamed Mass! One class per week attends this Mass in the church, while the rest stream it in their classrooms. 
