You may take the bowl home to be reminded that there are always empty bowls in the world.



VETERANS DAY HONORS


The Holy Cross School community invites all veterans and active military members to a special event on Tuesday, November 11, to show our appreciation for your service to our country.

WHEN: Sunday, October 5 from 2 to 3:30 pm WHERE: Hessel Park, Champaign (on the public sidewalk along the south side of the park)


