FIRE FOUNDATION OF CENTRAL ILLINOIS

FIRE was founded in 1996 by a group of parents who shared a common dream; for their children with special needs to attend their parish schools with siblings and friends. Since that time, through the efforts of parents, a dedicated board of directors, many talented volunteers and community members who embrace inclusive Catholic education, more than \$7 million has been granted to partner schools located in the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph (MO) to support inclusive Catholic education.

The FIRE Foundation, an independent 501(c)3 organization, makes it possible for partner Catholic schools to hire special educators and paraprofessionals and to acquire learning materials and technology that create successful learning experiences for all children.

You may take the bowl home to be reminded that there are always empty bowls in the world.



VETERANS DAY HONORS


The Holy Cross School community invites all veterans and active military members to a special event on Tuesday, November 11, to show our appreciation for your service to our country.
