October is National Bully Awareness Month. Here at Holy Cross, we support a **Bully Free School Environment**. As part of our continued effort to provide awareness against bullying, we will implement a month of bully-free activities. This will be beneficial to all students and staff at Holy Cross.

Oct. 3-7: Bully Awareness Workshop for Grades K-8

Bully Awareness Workshops were held for all students in all grades to educate them about the harms and dangers that bullying causes, and to show students what they can do to prevent and stop bullying.

Oct. 11-14: Culture Awareness Week

Last week we focused on the different cultures we have at Holy Cross.

Oct. 17–21: Stand Up for Others Against Bullying Week

This week we will focus on the theme "Stand Up for Others Against Bullying."

Did you know students who experience bullying are more likely to find peer actions more helpful than an educator or self-actions? By teaching children to stand up for one another, they learn to not only help their classmates and the importance of bully prevention, but that they can always turn to their classmates for help and support.

Oct. 24-28: Share-a-Kind-Word Week

Students will participate in creating posters, creating positive messages on post-It notes and handing them out to students at school, and share inspirational stories in the classroom.

Oct. 26: Orange Shirt Day to Support Bullying Awareness

Students and staff will demonstrate their commitment to end bullying by wearing an orange shirt. The school will be purchasing orange T-Shirts to wear at school on the 26th.
