





Empty Bowl Bowl Making



HISTORY AND CHARITY WORK

In 1882 our founder, Blessed Fr. Michael J. McGivney, established the Knights in response to anti-Catholic prejudice and dangerous factory working conditions that left

many families fatherless This has since flourished into the oldest and largest Catholic fraternal organization in the world with 2 million members worldwide. Because of his efforts, he has been Beatified and is one miracle away from Sainthood.

Since its inception, the Knights have been champions of diversity, inclusion, and social justice:

- ~~ Going into the 20th century we fought hard to help the families of immigrants preserve their faith and avoid financial disaster.
- ~~ In the 20th century we turned our attention to the growing threats of communism and fascism, which threatened communities and religious freedoms. We stood for racial equality and stopped the efforts of many hate groups. In the early 50s, we were instrumental in adding "One Nation under God" to the Pledge of Allegiance.
- ~~ In the 21st century our efforts expanded to aid persecuted Christians in the Middle East and war-torn regions such-as Ukraine.

We support priestly and religious vocations and have "adopted" seminarians and religious providing them financial support for years.

Besides our insurance and pro Catholic investing programs, the Knights of Columbus is a highly rated charity and has given to causes such as:

Disaster relief locally and globally; 400,000 Coats for Kids nationwide; supporters of Special Olympics; and over 1.5 million moms have seen their unborn babies through our ultrasound program in which we have funded over 1,800 ultrasound machines since 2009; including 2 ultrasound machines for our local Women's Care Center in order to rebuild and re-equip it after the arson attack.
