Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our diocese will soon take up the national collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD). Your support for this collection brings change to communities across the country and empowers those living in poverty to transform their communities into reflections of the Kingdom of God. For more than 50 years, CCHD has helped low-income people address the root causes of poverty and injustice by funding local organizations that empower low-income people to make positive impacts in their own communities. This grassroots model allows people to use their experiences and knowledge to build coalitions of faith leaders, local businesses, and other neighbors to work together to find solutions that benefit everyone.

With CCHD funding, the Community Lighthouse program, developed by Together New Orleans, has transformed churches and other neighborhood institutions into solar-powered facilities where people can shelter when natural disasters cause power outages. In 2023, Together New Orleans expanded its project to nine facilities, and it garnered recognition and project funding to expand the program even further. In addition, the organization implemented solar power training programs at the Community Lighthouses while working with local government to reform regulations, making solar power more available to low- and middle-income residents.

This record of success shows how your support for CCHD makes a positive impact in vulnerable, under-resourced communities across the country. When you give to the CCHD collection, you make an impact nationally and at home, because 25% of your contribution stays within our own diocese. This way you help your own community build on this legacy of success while also helping communities across the country.

Please prayerfully consider how you can help CCHD this year. Thank you for joining us to work on the margins and break the cycle of poverty.


