Guadalupe: The Miracle and the Message Week 3 - 58 minutes

Our Lady of Guadalupe Feast Day - December 12th The most important event in the evangelization of the New World occurred in December, 1531. Over the course of four days, the Virgin Mary, under the title of Our Lady of Guadalupe, appeared to an indigenous convert named Juan Diego. As a result of this encounter, and the image miraculously imprinted on Juan Diego's tilma (cloak), nine million Native Americans embraced the Catholic faith, and the Americas began its transformation into the Catholic hemisphere. Our Lady of Guadalupe's message of love had replaced the institutionalized violence of the Aztec culture and built a bridge between two worlds.

Guadalupe: The Miracle and the Message traces the history of this transformative event from the 16th century to the present. Featuring interviews with leading theologians, historians, and experts on the scientific inquiries into the miraculous image, this gripping film explores both the inexplicable mysteries behind the image, and the continued relevance of the Guadalupe apparition to the modern world.

New Funds at the **Online Giving Platform**

Recently, several new funds were added to our Online Giv- Online Giving ing platform located at the



Holy Cross Church web page. For those who don't like using cash or checks anymore, electronic means offer an easy way to donate or pay fees. One of the new funds is the Flower Fund. Donations to this fund are used to decorate the Church during the Christmas and Easter seasons. There is also an option of dedicating the donation as a memorial in honor of a family member or friend. Their names must be entered in a special space provided by the Online Giving platform.

Payment of various fees will become much easier using the following new funds: Family Formation Fee, Wedding Fee, and Miscellaneous Fees. The Family Formation Fee fund can be used to pay an annual fee for participation in the Family Formation program at our Parish. This program is an opportunity for the entire family to grow in faith and is open to all families, especially for those whose children are not enrolled in a Catholic school. Family Formation fulfills the need for religious education and sacramental preparation.

Miscellaneous Fees fund can be used to pay for seasonal Parish activities such as Bible Study, WATCH program, or other occasional events. In order to recognize what the payment was for, an additional note must be entered in the space provided. Wedding Fee fund can be used by couples who have already scheduled their wedding at Holy Cross Church.
