The **Growing Disciples** pastoral planning process will examine the current structure of parishes and schools to evaluate how they can best meet the needs of the faithful and address challenges facing the Church today.

The primary goals of the pastoral planning process are to:

- Enable the faithful to go make disciples within a mission-driven, sustainable structure of parishes and schools.
- Enhance the vibrancy of our parishes, schools and ministries.
- Increase our support of the happiness, health and holiness of our priests.

Why are we doing this? Why now?

The Church and its people continue to face unique opportunities and challenges as society evolves. In Illinois, and certainly in the Diocese of Peoria, the demographic landscape looks different than it did even 10 years ago, while the structural landscape has remained nearly the same.

The current challenges facing our diocese include:

- A changing regional and diocesan landscape
- National trends regarding religion
- Too few priests to staff more than 150 parishes.

While we have a strong and vibrant faith community, the current structural landscape combined with the above challenges limits our ability to fully live out our God-given mission as Catholics.
